Qualifying Process for the Men's & Ladies Classic

In 2009-2010, the top two Men and the top two Ladies will be eligible to participate in one WDF ranked tournament held in Canada. There are now six such tournaments offered across Canada. The decision regarding the tournament to which the winners will be travelling must be made by no later than July 1st, 2010.

Slight changes have been made to how recognition will be awarded this year and they are listed below.

The country has been divided into four geographical regions, designated as follows:

Western Region	British Columbia, Alberta, and Northwest
Mid Western Region	Saskatchewan, Manitoba and Northern Ontario
Central Region	Ontario, Quebec
Atlantic Region	New Brunswick, Nova Scotia, Prince Edward Island and Newfoundland/Labrador

Points will be awarded as follows:

To earn points, players must have been involved in a knockout round.

Accumulation of Points

The best **seven** finishes will be used from all events a member has participated in. A **maximum** of three tournaments can be counted from the home province and a **maximum** of two tournaments can be counted from any other province/territory (Member Body). Points can be attained from any tournament in any region. To receive points or to maintain points, a player must hold a valid NDFC membership by no later than April 1st.

Awards – Regions

The final standings for members within a region will be determined by the total points received by all players within that region, regardless of what region the points were attained in. The Top 2 Men and Women in each region will receive a plaque acknowledging their accomplishment, with the 3rd & 4th place finishers, in each region, receiving a diploma. In addition, the Top 8 Overall will receive a trophy.

Awards – Country

The final standings from the four regions will be merged and the Top 2 Men and the Top 2 Ladies will be eligible to participate in one of the six WDF ranked tournaments held in Canada. Their airfare, accommodations and entry fee into the Singles Event will be paid by the NDFC.

In the event of a tie in the overall country final listing, the following rules shall apply:

- The player that achieved the most top finishes (1st, and 2^{nds}. etc) will be declared the winner, e.g. the top two players have identical points (60).
- Player 1 had a 9 (runner-up) and a 7 (joint-third), although these points were not included in the grand total.
- Player 2 had no nines but a 7 and several 5's.
- Player 1 would be the winner.

In the event that there is still a tie because the overall points are identical, the winner will be the player who achieved the highest standing at the tournament that had the most participants in the Singles event.
